KNOW THE SIGNS

PHYSICAL

- Branding-scars, burns or tattoos
- Malnourished
- Serious dental issues
- Disoriented or confused
- Other physical signs of abuse

VERBAL

- Responds as if coached
- Allows someone else to speak for them
- Reluctant to discuss their injuries
- Fearful, anxious or paranoid

MEDICAL

- Urinary difficulties
- Pelvic pain
- Rectal trauma
- Chronic cardio or respiratory problems
- Drug addiction
- Infections
- Sleep Deprivation

Human Trafficking is the biggest industry you have never heard of.

According to the International Labor Organization, forced labor and Human Trafficking is a **\$150B** industry globally with **20.9M** victims worldwide.

Human Trafficking is defined under Florida law as the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud, or coercion.
